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Introduction of Case Study Chapters

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After introducing the foundational knowledge on intercultural competence in study abroad programs in Section I, Chapters 4-14 in Section II present unique case study models of short-term, faculty-led study abroad programs. The faculty leaders of each case study demonstrate how intercultural competencies in the areas of knowledge, skills, and attitudes were strategically incorporated into the activities, tasks, and assignments of the study abroad curricula. These intercultural competencies were adapted from Deardorff (2012).
